In his interview, Edwards made several accusations that the state mishandled the lead-in-water crisis (which he outlines in greater detail [here](#).)

Highlights:

- MDEQ failed to require corrosion control for Flint River water
- MDEQ misinformed the USEPA about Flint's corrosion control
- MDEQ revised the original LCR report which would have triggered federal law requiring residents be warned

The interview is at 11:35 am so I would need to know as soon as possible.

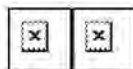
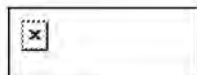
Two main things we would like to discuss: how the city conducted testing for lead and why DEQ did not require Flint to put corrosion control in place at the time of the switch.

The interview would be pre-recorded, not live, and would take about 10-15 minutes. A land line is preferred.

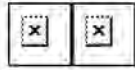
