Below is the wording I propose to use on our water-specific fact sheet for Flint regarding pets (domestic animals: dogs, cats, birds, etc). Can you please confirm that this is reasonable? Would actually providing unfiltered water to pets be OK? Or do you recommend filtered water if it's available?

Use filtered water for:

- Pets' water bowls

You can use unfiltered water for:

- Baths

Very little lead will absorb into your pet's skin from the water. If you notice your pet acting differently than normal, please contact your vet.
