Ron, per our discussion yesterday, here are two documents you may find useful. The Flint Lead History PDF is the recent and historical water testing data.

The other document is from the state department of health and human services. It's about blood lead level testing done on Flint kids. It shows a seasonal fluctuation that rises in the summer months – when folks have their windows open, mobilizing dust and lead paint elements, and kids are playing more outside and coming into contact with lead in soils.

We want people to take sources of lead in their homes seriously. The state takes the issue seriously and monitors for lead impacts regularly. This is that data.
