Here is my draft of the information you requested. I didn't have much to say about the 1986 Amendments that banned the use of lead. I guess we could add that this ban took effect in June of 1988 in Michigan, as that is the date I recall that the plumbing code changes to implement the then lead ban went into effect. It was also the date that Mike Kovach had us use for assisting PWS in identifying Tier I sampling sites – homes with copper plumbing installed between 1982 and June of 1988 when the high lead (50-50) solder ban took effect.

I also attached the 1990 document that shows what Michigan did to comply with the LCCA.
