County officials claim that continuing to buy water from the city of Detroit will cost the region \$2.1 billion during the next 25 years. By building a pipeline, that cost would no more than \$1.9 billion over the same period.

"It's cheaper to build our own system than to continue to pay more and more to the city of Detroit," Wright said. "This is about the least expensive way for our people to get the best quality water."

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
