Jennifer,

Hopefully Mike can provide you with any details as he is the most familiar with Genesee County water systems and their facilities. I don't know his schedule and he may be out for the week if tomorrow is his flex day.

I can tell you that Flint and Genesee County are customers of Detroit and as such, rely upon remotely located water treatment facilities (on the shore of Lake Huron north of Port Huron). Flint also has a standby treatment plant on the Flint River that can be pressed into service for potable water in an emergency. I believe it is located on the northern side of Flint, but again, Mike is more knowledgeable on this matter.

Both water systems do have pumping and storage facilities located throughout their service area and of course, underground transmission and distribution systems but I do not expect underground piping to be deemed vulnerable to a civil unrest scenario. If there are any storage tanks or pumping stations in this vicinity, Mike should know. He would also know if there are any other water systems near this location.
