Steve,

Flint's valve count is 7, 256 ...so 7,250 is good.

I have 550 miles of water system piping. This information was provided to me from the Water Service Center during the 2011 Sanitary Survey. We may want to subtract approx. 10 miles since Flint sold the 72-inch main to Genesee County.

The duration of both WTP emergency operation events in 2009 is correct.

Other steps being taken by the city (not operational) to limit the potential for future BWA's are as follows:

-Investigating different types of chlorine feed systems at each water storage reservoirs

-Investigating mixing system(s) at each reservoir (topic of tomorrow's site visit).

-Also, the city investigated and confirmed unauthorized water use that consisted of water theft at several residencies in the BWA area (running hoses to neighboring homes that are abandoned).

These have been eliminated and perpetrators are being prosecuted.
