Attached is a list of communities that self-identified at some point during their lead/copper monitoring that they had lead service lines and that lead service line locations were included in their sampling pool some time during the last 25 years.

It is possible for a community that might have had only a few lead service lines to have replaced them over time and yet they would still be on this list. My point is we should be careful how we use this list at this time, but it is an indication of which communities may be facing similar issues to Flint.
