Why did the Governor allow the city to switch away from DWSD initially?

(Would use last portion of the response I sent earlier) The then-emergency manager, mayor and city council approved the move to KWA and the state approved the transition. Following the city's decision to move to KWA, DWSD canceled flints contract effective April of 2014. The city faced limited options for its water source following the cancellation of its DWSD contract. The city felt compelled to make the switch. Once the city opted to move to KWA by 2016, Its contract with DWSD was canceled.
