Subject: Water supply in west michigan, blood levels

I work with the Muskegon area water supplies and recently became aware of this website, designed to display blood lead level data from MDHHS for 2012 and 2013. The concern is that the water supplies (around the state) may be singled out as the sole source of lead in children (in the light of media coverage of Flint's water supply issues).
