Maternal and child health epidemiology staff analyzed the MDHHS childhood lead poisoning data to assess whether or not the switch to using Flint River water for the city of Flint impacted childhood lead poisoning levels (≥ 5 micrograms per deciliter). An increase was noted after the switch but when controlling for such things as multiple tests, age of children and seasonality in a statistical model the difference was elevated but not statistically significant, that is not beyond chance.
