How to Destroy a City - the American Way.

It has been one month since I became involved with the City of Flint, Michigan, a community expressing deep concern about high sewer and water system rates, for drinking water that fails to meet basic water quality regulations.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency has publish that the average cost for water in the United States is \$2.00 per 1,000 gallons, including the service charge. Comparing apples to apples, Flint residents are paying \$15.80 per 1,000 gallons, almost 8-times the national average.

The City of Flint starts with a service charge of \$39.60 (if divided by a high average of 10 units, it represents an additional \$3.90/unit) and a unit charge of \$7.92/CCF; Flint's unit is 748 gallons. So, at \$11.82 per unit, a 10 unit bill would be equal to \$118.20 for 7,480 gallons.

If you can afford the water you're fortunate; if you cannot afford the water you are evicted from your homes or your businesses shutdown.

All of this is perpetrated with Democracy held hostage by a Governor appointed "Emergency Manager"...the elected Mayor a mere ceremonial figure head.
