That, too. This version puts it into words. I like it more than the columns of numbers.

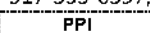

That is correct. And there should be a breakdown of adults and children later in the release. Those are the figures for the number of people who are above the federal action level. In those cases, DHHS staff members work directly the individuals to determine the source of the lead in the home, be it a particular faucet or pipes, or non-water factors such paint.

You'll note the historical data, showing the seasonal increases. There historically are higher levels reported in the summer months, for a variety of reasons.
