

This is not a situation where the Mayor and Council wanted to utilize one system with the EM reversing course. All involved in the decision-making process agreed KWA was the best long-term option for the City of Flint. With Flint's decision to go with KWA, DWSD terminated Flint's contract, effective April 17, 2014 (letter attached). Given that termination, Flint had two "options:"

-sign a long-term (30 year) agreement with DWSD, which was not economically feasible given the city's decision to go with KWA

-Use Flint River as an interim source (it had long been the city's backup) until KWA was on-line

It is also important to note that the current situation in Flint has been exacerbated by years of neglect and a lack of maintenance to the decades-old system. All this said, the most important issue now is moving things forward, through the collaborative State, City, and Foundation effort to ensure safe drinking water for the residents of Flint.
