In preparation for announcing additional appropriation measures related to the Flint water emergency in the upcoming FY 17 budget presentation, we'll be preparing a briefing document for legislators. As part of this effort, we want to include a Frequently Asked Questions document. This is where we really need your help.

Your budget staff should have a breakdown of each potential spending item related to your agency (both pending FY 16 supplemental items and FY 17 items). Current Issues Talking Points

Flint Mayor calls for immediate replacement of Flint pipes

- In a press conference today, Flint Mayor Karen Weaver called for immediate replacement of Flint's water infrastructure.
- Immediately removing pipes could potentially add to the infrastructure problem and result in higher costs for the city.
- Both Senate Minority Leader Jim Ananich and Virginia Tech water treatment expert Marc Edwards advise first mapping the city's pipes to determine the location of lead infrastructure.
- Edwards also says the state is taking the correct actions to make Flint's water safe again. Adding phosphate to the water to coat the pipes is a necessary first step toward ensuring safe drinking water for Flint residents.

- The Governor continues to work with Edwards and the Flint Water Interagency Coordinating Committee to identify and implement a successful long-term solution for Flint families.

Senate Minority Leader sends Governor Flint action letter

- The Governor's senior staff has been in close communication with state Sen. Jim Ananich and have met with him frequently to provide updates, answer questions and get feedback.
- The Governor remains committed to providing Flint residents with the resources needed to implement both short and long-term solutions and will continue to work closely with Ananich.
- The Governor will announce a long-term funding proposal in his formal budget presentation next week to further address Flint water.
